Make A Wish	<ul> <li>The school has raised over \$3500 from student donations</li> <li>Fundraiser event at Batch Ice Cream was extremely well attended - do not know yet the exact amount going to Make A Wish from the event</li> </ul>

Budget	<ul> <li>The district is asking for 1.5 million; Blueberry will remain at 20 classrooms for the 23-24 school year         <ul> <li>4th grade will reduce to three classrooms</li> <li>1st grade will increase to four classroom</li> </ul> </li> <li>A special education academic tutor was hired for the 22-23 school year as there were no applicants to fill the Grade 3-5 special education teacher position. That position will change back to a special education teacher for the 23-24 school year</li> </ul>
Math Curriculum	<ul> <li>The roll out of the Bridges Math Curriculum is going very well at Blueberry</li> <li>Teachers are feeling a lot more comfortable with the curriculum</li> <li>Stacey noted that teachers have appreciated the half day unit planning meetings with the math coaches         <ul> <li>Those planning meetings will continue next year with some of the meetings focused on math and some meetings focused on literacy</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Student Council (starting up again)	<ul> <li>The second session of the BHS Student Council will run from early March through May;</li> <li>Student council members will plan a couple of BHS Spirit Days and organize a school/community event</li> </ul>
Chromebook/Charger situation	<ul> <li>Similar to other schools in LPS, Blueberry ran out of Chromebooks to loan out due to wear and tear and some Chromebooks being damaged</li> <li>The district is looking at an insurance program for the 23-24 school year to pay for damaged Chromebooks         <ul> <li>Families would pay a small fee to insure their child's Chromebook</li> </ul> </li> <li>The district was able to recently purchase a handful of Chromebooks for each school to loan out and also has some extra Chromebooks in reserve for MCAS testing.</li> </ul>

Welcome	The goal is how to make Blueberry better and the focus of SC. What's manageable for us.
School Improvement Plan	Closely tied to the SIP.  MTSS. Met with the other 2 elementary schools to where we are in this process, early steps. What is our process? Meeting with teachers individually to hear concerns, if currently in intervention, receive updates. Hear teachers' concerns, make suggestions for tier 1 and/or tier 2 instruction. Making sure tier 1 is solid before moving to intervention. Trying more of a push-in model rather than pulling out.  Hoping to be fully staffed with a Math specialist and tutor soon.  How do we build capacity in the classroom? How do we become more inclusive-more push in services.  Building more partnerships within the community.  Checking in with the other elementary schools- on the same page. During the first staff meeting all discussed UDL and MTSS. We are in the infancy stage of UDL. Many teachers have made this an actional goal in their PPG and SLG. Each teacher completed an inventory on their learning style- led to good conversations. Got us thinking about different learning styles. Handed out current article on UDL. BHS & District goal.  VOG is also in the early stages. In the survey many were unaware of the VOG. What does that mean here at BH? Want to get posters to show around the school.  Questions: none at this time.

MCAS Results	It's one data point, we need to look at the whole child. We look at BAS 3 times a year, Bridges assessments, formative & summative assessments, and i-Ready. Math curriculum last year was Envision and 3 pilots going on- Illustrative, Bridges, & ?
	Math ELA-dip in Exceeding, down in Meeting, increase in PM, and increased not meeting. Science/Tech
	Thoughts/Questions: none at this time.

Heather- the question might be a bit misleading- not just weekly update but how my child is doing besides the report card.</li> </ol>
	Zach- how about a URL 3-4 questions- what's working? What's notThis might be a good check-in after several months.
	Michaela- maybe right after P/T conferences to see if they received feedback on their child's
	progress.
